Keynote:

Meaningful Transition Planning: Using Legal Tools for Success

In this session, school law attorney, Jeanne Kincaid, will highlight the legal requirements under state and federal laws that are necessary to guide IEP teams to help develop effective transition planning for students hoping to go on to college and the world of work. Attorney Kincaid will share with the participants how the courts have interpreted the legal requirements and offer suggestions on how everyone, working collaboratively, can improve the transition results for all students with disabilities.
